12	research level with the aim of strengthening scientific cooperation between the universities
13	For this purpose, a dual/double PhD. degree program (DDP) has been planned with the
14	specific regulations listed in this agreement as the guideline for operation.
15	specific regulations noted in time agreement as the government of the productions
16	The quota for participation in the DDP is a maximum of 4 graduate students per year: 2 from
17	Department of Medical Laboratory and Biotechnology, College of Health Sciences at
18	Kaohsiung Medical University and 2 from Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Sciences
19	at Chulalongkorn University.

21	I. Applications by students for participation
22	1. A student under the DDP can only be admitted after an agreement between supervisors
23	at CU and KMU has been reached on a shared project and a notice has been given to
24	admission boards
25	2. Each student will have a home department, which has the main responsibility for the
26	student sadmission, economic situation, and employment, and a host department at
27	which the complementary training is undertaken
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29	II. Curriculum design
30	1. All students under the DDP will have at least one supervisor from each of CU and
31	KMU, the supervisor associated with the home department will be the main supervisor,
32	and the supervisor associated with the host department will be the assisting supervisor.
33	In addition to these two, up to two additional assisting supervisors can be added and
34	one additional assisting supervisor must be from CU. Selection of supervisors at each
35	university will depend upon the research project and existing research collaborations
36	of supervisors between the home and host universities
37	2. CU and KMU will separately screen applicants from their (prospective and currently

- 38 enrolled) student bodies to be admitted to the DDP.
  - 3. The application procedure is initially performed under the home department sauspice, and when this is completed the relevant documentation is transferred to the host department at which the corresponding process is performed.
  - 4. All students admitted must fulfill credit point accumulation requirements of both universities. The number of transferring credits along grades from CU to the host university must be no more than half the acquired total units for graduation at CU.
  - 5. The DDP must result in at least one international and one national publications for CU. The number of publications should fulfill the graduation requirements of both universities combined. The publications should be in internationally acknowledged journals with peerreview, and the PhD students should feature as first author.
  - 6. Two (2) dissertations, that are not more than 25% of overlapping contents including results will be written in English, and of both cases, given some contents may be shared and must specify in text in the dissertation(s) that this dissertation was also used to fulfill the partner university degree program. The format of two (2) dissertations, that are not more than 25% of overlapping contents including results, should meet the requirements of each university separately.


## III, Duration of study

- 1. The duration of DDP, in the normal case, corresponds to no less than 24 months.
- 2. During the DDP the student will have to spend a minimum of 12 months at each of the two universities CU and KMU, pursuing the agreed project plan Period of staying at host university shall not exceed three (3) years

#### IV. Dissertation

- Upon completion of the project a thesis written in English will be published and subsequently defended during a public dissertation performed in English at the home university.
- 2. The design and composition of the thesis, requirements for publication and availability should be made according to the regulations of both universities.
- The dissertation grading committee will be composed according to regulations of both universities. As far as possible at least one member of the committee should be appointed from the host university.
- A decision by one university not to award the degree will not preclude the other university from awarding the degree.

# V. Intellectual property rights



- 2 Joint research and development projects and co-author publications shall be forwarded through collaboration and determined through consultation between two parties.
- The parties agree that students will own the intellectual property they create which is directly related to their research project, unless other arrangement are agreed in advance by the students, CU and KMU.

If controversial issues regarding intellectual or industrial property rights arise, the parties agree to use their best efforts to settle any dispute concerning this agreement amicably. However, if the parties are unable to resolve any dispute concerning this agreement amicably, the dispute shall be finally settled under the Rules of Arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce by one or more arbitrators appointed in accordance with the said Rules. The arbitration shall in this case take place in Zürich.

## VI. Degree conferral

1. On successful completion of the DDP, the degree of PhD will be conferred by both home and host universities on the participating student who meets the graduation requirements of both home and host universities.

### VII. Tuition and fees

- 1. Students participating in the DDP are responsible for the payment of any necessary tuition fees to their home university. Admission fee and tuition fees at the host university are waived.
- 2. Participating students do not have to pay credit or bench fees at the host university.
- 3. Costs related to the dissertation will be covered by the university at which the dissertation is performed. If two dissertations are performed, each university will cover costs related to respective dissertation.
- 4. Participating students may be competitively considered for a stipend and/or tuition scholarship at the home and/or host university, according to the eligibility criteria of the universities. Other incidental fees and charges, travel and associated costs, accommodation, and personal expenses are the responsibility of the students.
- 5. Students are responsible for arranging a suitable insurance plan, which must include sufficient medical coverage. The cost of the insurance will be paid by the students (unless special arrangements are made by the home or host university). It is



112 recommended that students consider purchasing additional travel and health insurance 113 to provide broader coverage. 114 115 VIII, Effectiveness, amendments and termination 116 1. This agreement shall come into effect on the date of the final signature. This agreement 117 is valid for five years and may be reviewed at any time. 118 2 Should either of the two universities CU and KMU consider that any part of the present 119 agreement is no longer appropriate, that university can propose an amendment Any 120 amended version will come into effect when signed by both universities 121 3. If termination of the present agreement becomes necessary, written notice must be 122 given to the other university at least six months prior to the desired day of effect of the 123 termination, and the reason for termination explained Termination of this agreement 124 will not affect any student who has already been admitted to the DDP and those students 125 shall be allowed to undertake and complete the DDP. 126 4. If the present agreement is terminated, both universities shall fulfill their duties and 127 responsibilities as home and host universities, respectively, based on good faith to 128 protect the rights of students who have enrolled in the DDP. 129 130 IX Application for suspension of studies in the DDP, and return from suspension 131 1. For application for suspension of studies, and return from temporary suspension, the 132 regulations of the home university shall be taken into consideration 133
